



## Cross reference separate PNRs using Total Complete Party TCP

### Total Complete Party - TCP

When passengers who are travelling together are booked on different PNRs, the multiple PNRs should be **CROSS-REFERED** with the airline reference using OSI (SI) or Vendor Remark (VR ) format.

Cross referencing the Airline PNRs with the total number of passengers are called TCP (Total Complete Party) .

Service Information Entry (OSI) - >SI.UL\*TCP2 WITH UL REF \* HS85WS  
Vendor Remark Entry - >V.AUL\* TCP2 WITH UL REF \* HS85WS

### Points to Note :

- ◆ There has to be more than one PNR with passengers travelling together. Booked on separate PNRs
- ◆ Passengers should travel together only on specific sector/s on one specific airline.
- ◆ TCP entry should be entered on each Booking File to cross-refer one to the other.
- ◆ Child on a separate PNR has to be TCP with the Adult PNR to indicate that the child is accompanied by an adult. Failing to do so airlines might raise ADMs assuming child is an Unaccompanied Minor (UM).
